Charlie Hlavin suggested renting a truck from Home Depot to assist with the moving.

Cheryle brought attention to the new SCOPP purchase of wireless microphones – also that we now have a vendor for purchasing individual jellies, cream, butter, etc. for the events.

Cheryle thanked Dave Daniels for repairing one of our kitchen carts.

Joel Roth hosted a Hurricane Preparedness Program for the park on 6-19-19 and he thanked SCOPP for providing the refreshments.

On 6-21-19 SCOPP will provide refreshments for the PPHA Meeting featuring our State Representative.
