**NOVEMBER ELECTION**  
**TAXMAGEDDON OR TAXAPALOOZA?**

Many experts are calling the upcoming status of income taxes by the fanciful names in the title as well "The Super Bowl of Taxes", "the 2025 Tax Cliff" and the "Tax Sunset". Most people don't know that depending on the outcome of the November 2024 election lots of income tax brackets, credits, deductions, Social Security, and Medicare taxes could change. The current provisions of tax reform laws were put into place in 2017 by the President and Congress, but they are set to expire on December 31, 2025 -TAXMAGEDDON.

All tax laws are passed by Congress after being proposed by its Party, by the President, by lobbyists, and by interested groups or individuals. Then they are approved or vetoed by the President. Congress can override a Presidential veto by a 2/3 vote. Each party assembles a platform at their national convention. I have tried to highlight several tax related items in each platform that may affect many of us although there are many other issues in the platforms. Please read the entire Platforms attached to this article for many more details.

The Republican Convention was held in July. First and foremost, its platform is that the tax changes that their candidate, Donald Trump, made in 2017 would be made permanent. Some of those tax laws that are now, and would continue to be, capital gains tax rates of 0-15-20 percent, the stepped-up basis (fair market value) for assets when they are inherited and not what the deceased originally paid for them, and the estate tax exemption at \$13.6 million. That basically means no middle-class person pays estate tax.

They also propose to extend the 10-12-22-24-32-35-37 percent income tax rates we all pay. The Republicans also propose that tips income received by hospitality and restaurant workers would be tax free. They would use tax incentives and credits to help promote homeownership. Republicans support dropping the 21% corporate tax rate to 20% or lower to encourage business here in America. They want a 10% across-the-board tariff on imported goods to help American businesses. They want to eliminate the clean-energy credits. They have promised to keep Social Security and Medicare safe. They oppose the creation of a Central Bank Digital Currency. They will increase Energy Production across the board, streamline exploration permitting, and end restrictions on oil, natural gas, and coal.

The Democratic Convention was held August 19 having selected Kamala Harris as its candidate. Their tax proposals fall into four main categories: additional taxes on high wage earners, more taxes on other investments of the wealthy, higher taxes on US businesses, and more tax credits for a variety of taxpayers

proposed to raise the corporate tax to 28%. The platform does not mention a stand on crypto currency or Central Bank Digital Currency. They want to raise tax rates to 10-15-25-28-33-35-39.6 percent for income taxes. The Democrats want to eliminate subsidies for oil and gas companies. They want to give a \$10,000 mortgage relief tax credit to first time homebuyers and a \$25,000 down payment credit to all families who have never owned a home. They propose several housing tax credits for builders of low-income housing.

They propose to eliminate the stepped-up basis on assets like homes, stock, property etc. This means that when you inherit a home or stocks that your parents or spouse paid \$50,000 for in 1970 but is now worth \$300,000, your tax basis would be \$50,000 not the current fair market value of \$300,000. The Democratic platform proposes eliminating the capital gains tax rates. All income would be taxed at regular income tax rates. In addition, they want to lower the estate tax exemption to \$7 million, which would still eliminate most middle-class taxpayers from paying that tax.

We, the electorate, need to be fully informed what each candidate's platform is not just big "one" issue topics that is blared at us through the media. Even though these platforms are filled with generalities and don't always specify how they will pay for proposals, they are crucial. Unfortunately, the candidates of both parties are adding promises that are not in their platforms as they speak before groups and the media.

The Platforms state the way each Party will govern our country, which will affect every single aspect of our lives – not only with regard to taxes but also from how much gas costs, what kind of refrigerator you can buy, what mortgage rates will be, what jobs there will be, who can vote, who can buy up farmland, and many, many more vital issues.

## HOW TO STOP PROMOTIONAL EMAILS WHERE YOU CAN'T UNSUBSCRIBE

You've been diligently managing your inbox and unsubscribing from countless email lists you no longer want. But suddenly, you're bombarded with promotional emails that lack an *unsubscribe* option. Don't worry – you're not alone in this frustrating situation. Let's explore some effective strategies to tackle these pesky emails and keep your inbox clean.

**Understanding the problem:** Before we dive into solutions, it's crucial to understand why you're receiving these emails and why they're potentially dangerous. **First and foremost**, never click links or open attachments from unfamiliar senders. These could be phishing attempts or contain malware that could compromise your device and personal information.

**Why some emails lack unsubscribe options:** Legitimate companies are required by law to include unsubscribe options in their marketing emails. If you're receiving promotional emails without this option, they might be:

- Spam or phishing attempts

If you get any, **STOP SPAM** Emails; DO NOT CLICK ON THEM, it will be an; OOPS! YOU CLICKED ON A SPAM EMAIL AND ADDED YOUR INFO TO WHAT LOOKED LIKE A LEGIT SITE.

### TOP 5 WAYS TO HANDLE PROMOTIONAL EMAILS THAT DON'T PROVIDE AN UNSUBSCRIBE OPTION:

Promotional emails can be a nuisance, especially when they don't provide an easy way to unsubscribe. These emails clutter your inbox, making it difficult to find important messages and reducing your overall productivity. Fortunately, there are several effective strategies to manage and reduce these unwanted emails, even when an unsubscribe option isn't available.

**1) Mark As Spam:** Most email providers, like Gmail and Outlook, have a "Mark as Spam" or "Report Spam" option. When you mark an email as spam, your email provider will automatically filter similar emails into your spam folder in the future.

**2) Block The Sender:** If you consistently receive unwanted emails from the same sender, you can block their email address. This will prevent any future emails from that sender from reaching your inbox. However, this may be a temporary solution, as spammers are always changing their email addresses, so this may not be a good long-term solution. It doesn't hurt to do it, though.

**3) Contact The Sender Directly:** Sometimes, reaching out to the sender and requesting to be removed from their mailing list can be effective. Look for contact information within the email or on the sender's website.

**4) Report Phishing and Spam:** If you believe that the emails you are receiving are spam or phishing attempts, report them to your email provider.

**5) Use A Third-Party Unsubscribe Tool:** There are several tools available, such as Clean Email, that can help you manage and unsubscribe from unwanted emails, even if they don't provide an unsubscribe link.

**Create a private and secure new email address:** Did you know you can create a disposable email address? The best way to keep your emails private is to use an encrypted email server. Once you have your new email address, you'll want to slowly start unsubscribing from your old email address and resubscribing to the new email address.

**Create an alias email address (for total control):** Yes, we know the thought of creating a whole new email sounds like a lot of work. But we can assure you that it is way simpler than you think, and it will keep your main email address inbox cleaner and more clutter-free than ever before.

**What is an alias email address:** An alias email address is a forwarding email address that you can keep separate from your main email inbox, but still have access to all those emails. You can create tons of different alias email addresses depending on what you want that specific alias to be used for.

Some examples include:

- Promotional or discount alias for all the stores you shop at
- Work-related alias for all your business emails
- School alias for keeping track of all your assignments

Other methods and tips;

- Don't reveal your email address on public sites
- Install strong antivirus software
- Never let scammers get a hold of your email to begin with

**KEY TAKEAWAYS:** We've certainly covered a lot of ground in our battle against those pesky promotional emails. It's clear that while these unwanted messages can be a real headache, we're not powerless against them. From marking emails as spam to creating alias addresses, we've got quite a toolkit at our disposal. Remember, it's not just about keeping our inboxes tidy – it's about protecting our digital well-being and privacy too. So, the next time you're faced with a flood of promotional emails, take a deep breath and put these strategies into action.

## THE FIRST THANKSGIVING Resident Ron Groh's Connection To The Mayflower And The First Thanksgiving

Ron's 10<sup>th</sup> great grandparents were among the 102 passengers on the Mayflower when it arrived in November 1620. John Howland, traveled as a manservant and assistant to John Carver, a wealthy Londoner, and was neither a "Saint" as the Pilgrims were called, nor a "Stranger," engaged for a specific duty, as was the soldier, Myles Standish. Carver died during the first winter.

Following are several notations from the Mayflower log written by Christopher Jones, Master. *Week of 9/23 – 10/3 – "In one of the heaviest storms, while lying at hull, a lusty young man, one of the passengers, John Howland by name, coming upon some occasion above the grating latticed covers to the hatches, was with the seel (roll) of the ship thrown into the sea but caught hold of the topsail halyards, which hung overboard and ran out at length; yet he held his hold, though he was sundry fathoms under water, till he was hauled up the same rope to the brim of the water and then with a boathook and other means got into the ship again and his life saved. He was something ill with it."* On November 11<sup>th</sup>, as the ship lay at anchor in Cape Cod Bay, John was the thirteenth man to sign *The Mayflower Compact*. He was one of the 10 men that were from the Mayflower to decide a location of the new colony.

Also on the Mayflower was another set of (11<sup>th</sup>) great grandparents, John and Joan Tilley and their daughter Elizabeth. John also was among the 10 men sent from the Mayflower to decide a location of the new colony and he also signed *The Mayflower Compact*. Elizabeth's parents died during the first winter, along with over half of the passengers. In 1623, John Howland and Elizabeth Tilley were married. They had 11 children. John and Elizabeth were among the approximately 50 remaining Mayflower passengers that celebrated the very first Thanksgiving in 1621 along with members of the Wampanoag tribe. Ron had dozens of ancestors arrive in America in the 1600's, not only in Massachusetts but in Maryland, Virginia, and New York. Many fought in the Revolutionary War – one serving under George Washington.

All the 1600's ancestors were from his mother's side. The Groh name was German, and that line didn't arrive here until 1910. I have two HUGE binders and many file folders on his family genealogy. It is so fascinating. One line came to Canada (Quebec) in the 1600's and some of them knew Samuel Champlain. They were some of the earliest settlers in New France.

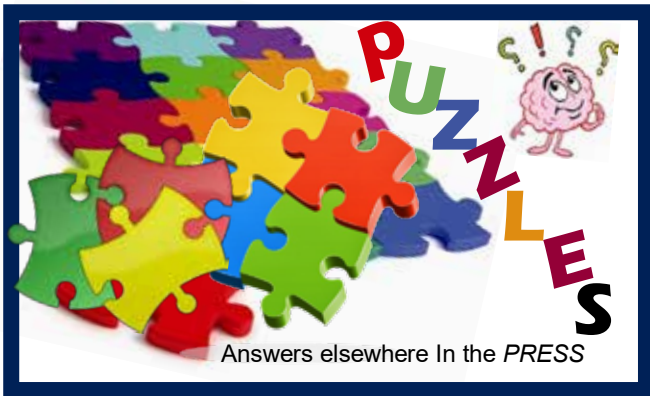

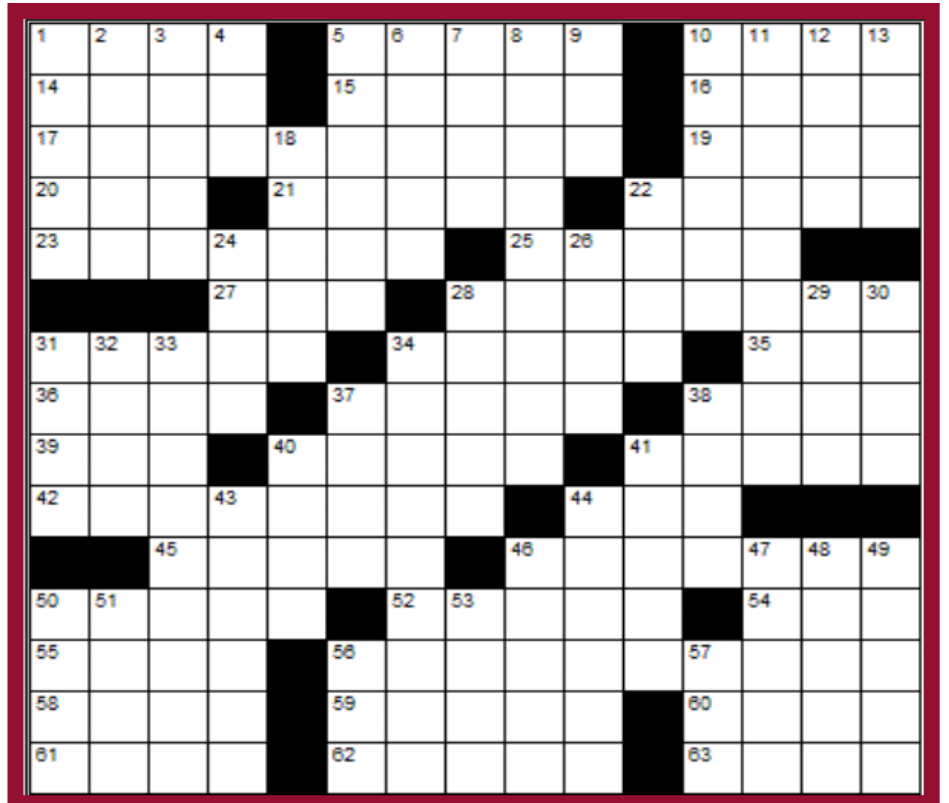

### WOULD YOU TAKE THIS JOURNEY??

One reason that I always cite to explain why this area developed slowly, and it's the case along much of the east coast of Florida, is the difficulty in getting here, particularly if someone wanted to move here. In an earlier article I wrote about about the hardships newcomers faced once they got off the train in Sebastian. I came across this book in our museum library "Early Life Along the Indian River", compiled by Anna Pearl Leonard Newman, published in 1953. With that publication date, she was able to interview early settlers and get firsthand accounts of their journey here. F. Charles Gifford told this story of his family's arrival.

"My oldest sister Cora, her husband O. I. Morse, and their three children came along with my parents, driving a covered wagon [from Randolph, VT] to New London, Conn., then all the family came from there by Sound Boat to New York. There we had to wait several days for passage to Jacksonville. We finally got on a cattle steamer, the Mallory Line "Amazon". It only had 2 staterooms, and our family now consisted of Father, Mother, Baby sister (who was 3) and myself (then 9 years old), our hired man Britt, horses, wagon, tools, household equipment and my older sister's family of five (2 adults and 3 children.)"

**Stop for a minute and imagine the ten of them living in two staterooms!! This was not a luxury liner. Charles continues his story!**

"Conditions on the 'Amazon' were very primitive. Meals were served on a tin plate with a spoon. If you wanted to wash, a sailor dipped water from the side of the boat. Sanitary conditions were also bad. Toilets were a hole in a rough board, with a 6- or 8-inch pipe run down to the water line on the outside of the boat, and was washed out with a bucket if, and when, washed. The odor from the horses on the steamer also added to the unpleasantness."

"We came through a severe storm between Cape Hatteras and Jacksonville. No children were allowed above, and we all had to stay in the hold. Early morning, about daylight, water came through the hatch, and we thought they were washing the decks. The waves were, and we got wet."

"There was a yellow fever epidemic in Jacksonville in '88, thus we came on this boat to avoid quarantine. Of course we could not go ashore. The St John's River steamer "Everglades" was brought along side, and everything was transferred in the daytime as it was believed yellow fever was carried in the night air. There were no lights in Jacksonville at that time, and there were only gas lights in New York City."

"In due time we landed at Enterprise Junction where we loaded our belongings onto a boxcar for Titusville. **There we unloaded everything on the Riverbank at Sand Point and camped 10 days waiting for a boat to come down to the Narrows,** as the section from Ft. Pierce to Sebastian was called."

"We came down on a barge "Frost Line" after loading up the family, stock and a two-months supply of groceries. It was a decked barge and hired for the trip. We tied up at the foot of what is now Osceola Boulevard in Vero Beach early one morning, November 21, 1988. We took the horses off first, then removed the wagon, a piece at a time, and reassembled it on shore. We caught fish for breakfast then loaded up and started for the log house, [which had been built by the father before he went back to Vermont for the rest of his family] and had to circle to the south through the marsh to get to over on dry land. The mosquitoes were thick."

"Horseflies, mosquitos and sandflies made the livestock miserable. We dug a surface well, two feet deep, and dipped up the water. We cooked outside over an open fire, keeping 3 fires going around the door so the wind would blow smoke either way. We slept under netting tucked under the mattress, and the mattresses were made from palmetto fronds. This was my introduction to Florida pioneering!"

Hello Park Place, we are so happy to be back after our quite scary and frightening encounter with Hurricane Milton. Thankfully, for the most part, our beautiful community was spared with just minimal damage around the Park. We were truly blessed! Something like this makes us really appreciate what a great place we live in, with neighbors helping neighbors, checking on those here and who are still away. Watching our community come together and help one another, seeing the efforts to collect food and other necessities for those who were so impacted by this horrific storm certainly makes one proud to be part of this beautiful place of ours.

So, despite Milton, we still ventured out to do our food review for you. This trip took us to Sebastian Saltwater Marina Restaurant, formerly known as Captain Butchers. It's located at 1732 Indian River Dr., Sebastian. Upon entering the restaurant, the hostess asks if you sit inside or outside. In large with a big bar, two rooms with tables and booths, and large windows so you can look out over the outside deck and the marina full of beautiful boats. The outside area is right on the water with another large bar and tables with umbrellas and a beautiful view. They do not accept reservations for outside but only for inside. The hours are Sunday through Saturday 11:00 am to 9:00 pm, Happy Hour is from 11:00 am to 6:00 pm., and the \$5.00 Bar Appetizer Menu from 2:00-5:30 is available at the inside and outside bar only.



Our waitress Victoria approached us promptly since we were the only ones in the restaurant. We chose to sit inside with a window view and Victoria gave us ample time to look over the menu and advised us of the specials. On to our choices; Appetizers: Fish Dip-smoked fish dip, red onions, jalapeños, diced tomatoes, pita chips for \$12.00, the pita chips were delicious but the dip was bland; Coconut Shrimp, hard breaded and fried with orange marinated sauce for \$14.00, the sauce was tasty however the shrimp were a little too hard fried for our liking; Calamari, breaded fried calamari, fried spinach, marinara sauce for \$13.00, which was delicious. Cup of Lobster bisque soup, extremely creamy but no meat for \$6.00; cup of clam chowder - tasty but not very thick for \$5.00. Fresh catch of the day Triple Tail, grilled and topped with Beurre Blanc sauce, broccoli and coconut rice for \$36.00 was tasty; grilled Mahi sandwich served with lettuce and chopped tomatoes, and Cole slaw for \$16.00 and fried sweet potatoes were \$4.00 extra and over cooked. Mahi was good but a little dry. Another entrée was fried grouper basket with French fries and coleslaw, ample food and tasty for \$18.00, and lastly, Fried Shrimp Basket, rice, Cole slaw, tasty \$17.00. At this point dessert was out of the ques-

Our overall rating is a 5 for the ambiance and a 3+ for the food. Due to our recent rent increase we were thinking for our next adventure we would try Burger King for their \$5.00 meal - just kidding, maybe...

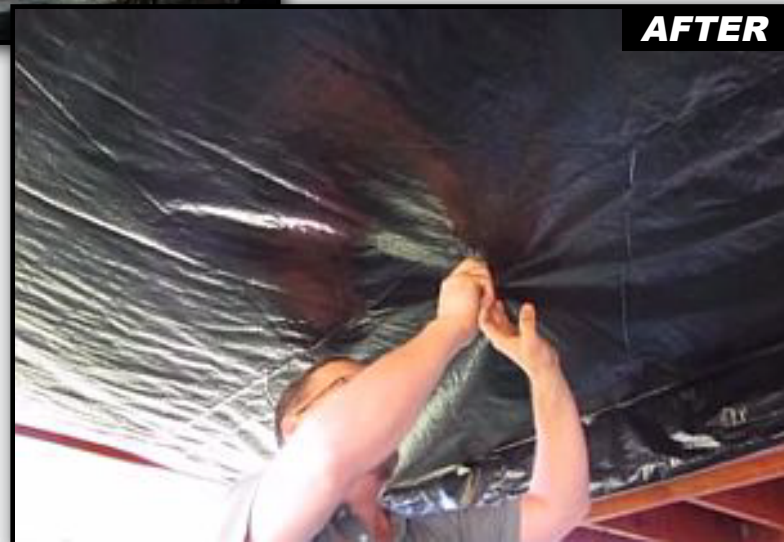

A Free Service From Your Park Place Homeowners Association

## A NEEDED CHANGE IN YOUR CARES PROGRAM

The Park Place Homeowners Association volunteer CARES program has been loaning medical, mobility, and handicap devices to residents since we started the program more than five years ago

What started as residents asking if we had a use for a walker or wheelchair, crutches or a cane evolved into a ready source of such equipment when needed by a resident. The donations of useable devices began to fill two garages, so a storage shed, thanks to Cheryl Merrifield of Sun Communities, was obtained to house our inventory of more than 60 devices.

Now, we strive to help the needy resident with the device they need, if we have it, the same or the next day. Residents also "preorder" a piece of medical equipment to be waiting after a surgery or procedure.

We trust that our fellow residents understand that these are equipment loans only. While we don't charge for the service, we do take donations or either equipment or money. Any funds received have been used for such diverse needs as: hurricane straps to hold our storage shed down, short aluminum ramps to lend, 4-wheel walker tennis balls, and maintenance on the equipment. We strive to keep our equipment in "like new" condition.

That brings us to the point of this article.

Since mid-October, we have asked residents borrowing CARES equipment, to sign a "Release, Waiver of Liability and Agreement".

This is being done to help protect the volunteer delivering the device, members of the Park Place Homeowners Association and the Association Board as a legal entity. Though we have never had a problem or complaint about the equipment lent, due to the overall increase in litigation everywhere, we consulted the Association's Lawyer, and he supplied an agreement that he advised we use. We modified it slightly to fit the CARES Program and the entities related to it.

Remember, through the CARES Program, you can borrow equipment here on site, AT NO COST, when you need it. It's delivered direct to your door. There is no need to deal with searching for a commercial supplier, rental fees, complex rental agreements, availability, as well as the time and cost to pick up and return that piece of equipment.

Again, this change to the program is not intended to discourage you from requesting a device. It is designed to provide those who are offering CARES a degree of protection.
